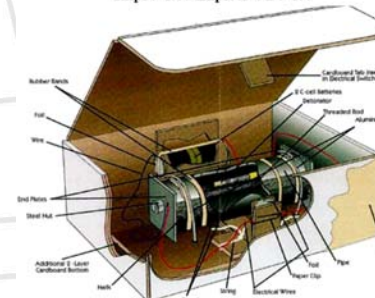
Counter-Narrative Support to JIEDDO

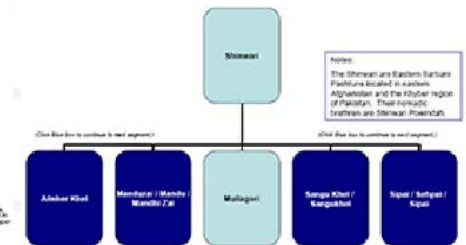

Over the last twenty-five years, Thomas H. Johnson has developed and sustained a record of providing research (applied and basic), analytical models/decision aids, and simulations to organizations concerned with international affairs, defense policy, and national security. Professor Johnson has published in leading journals in the areas of Third World politics, conflicts, insurgencies and terrorism (especially Africa and South/Central Asia), foreign policy analysis and peace research/conflict resolution modeling and simulation, political and defense economics, Johnson has taught at the University of Southern California and the Foreign Service Institute, and frequently lectures at Service Academies. Before joining the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School, he served on the research faculty of George Mason University.

Professor Johnson was appointed to the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School's National Security Affairs Department in December 2003. At NPS, Johnson is teaching courses on Afghanistan, Central Asian crises, politics, terrorism and security.

He serves as a member of the US delegation to the NATO ATP 45 and co-chairman of the sub panel of NBC Communication and Information System Interoperability and Integration. Professor Johnson also serves as a Senior Research Associate for NPS's Center for Contemporary Conflict where he has conducted research on Afghanistan, Jihadist, and Terrorism.
